#### Toy Library

We have recently refreshed our Toy Library Bags in the foyer. They can be found hung on the pegs below the welcome board. Please feel free to take a bag home for up to 7 days at a time, and return it after 7 days to ensure other children get a chance to engage with a variety of resources at home.

The resources that can be borrowed include ideas and resources to cover all seven areas of development. Most recently we have included Numicon to support Mathematical concepts and a Very Hungry Caterpillar themed bag to support the children's understanding of the lifecycle of a caterpillar.

Your child's key person will also lend home specific resources to suit your children's age and stage of development throughout the year.

#### Reminders

- Please ensure you are bringing a contribution of fruit for the snack bowl each week, for example, a small bunch of bananas, a bag of apples or an exotic fruit.

### Tapestry - Your Child's Online Journal

It is essential that you are accessing your child's online account so that you are keeping up to date with their progress and development. Please like and comment on your children's observations, and let us know what you think - it is so important that we know whether or not you have read the observations. Each key person will share your

child's current developmental targets, and ideas for activities to try at home that will support their learning. At the end of each half term you will sent an overview of your child's development, which will show each Area of

Learning. The Seven Areas of Leasnring are:

Communication and Language (CL)

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Physical Development (PD)

Literacy (L)

Maths (M)

Understanding the World (UTW)

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

You will notice that the level of development will either be listed as: No Concerns, Review or Concerns (Please note, this is not our choice of language, but we are unable to edit this on Tapestry as it is an external system).

No Concerns: You will see this when your child is meeting the expected developmental milestones, when they are demonstrating progression in their learning which is consistent and when they are able to apply their knowledge in different contexts.

Review: You will see this when your child is generally demonstrating progression in their learning, but it may be inconsistent and they may be unable to apply their learning in different contexts. Equally, if their learning has plateaued or halted, this will be under review. You will also see this if your child's key-person does not feel they have enough information to make a solid judgement, and will therefore monitor progress/support their development closely in order to make an accurate judgement.

Concerns: You will see this if your child is receiving a more intense level of targeted support in an area of learning to help them meet their developmental milestones.

All recorded information relating to each assessment is accessible via Tapestry, however, we primarily use our knowledge of the children i.e. what we know about their temperament, behaviours and learning dispositions.
